How to get started.

It's easy to recycle.

- Use the information on the inside of this brochure to learn what items are recyclable.
- To increase recycling efforts, make sure to bag garbage and recyclable items separately and place them into the appropriate containers provided (garbage into tan or black containers) (recyclables into blue containers).
- Once the containers are delivered to the Materials Recovery Facility, the bagged garbage is pulled out of the sorting line and sent to the landfill. The recyclable materials are sorted, separated and sent to processors for reuse.

YARD WASTE & COMPOSTING

- Mix "green" yard waste with "brown" materials
such as dry leaves and shredded paper, which has
carbon.
- Keep the compost pile damp but not wet.
- Add vegetables, fruits, grains, breads, flour, etc.
- Do not use proteins (meat, poultry, fish, dairy, etc.).
- Do not use pet waste.
- Avoid all chemical (pesticides and herbicides).
- Turn your pile as often as you can.
- Avoid all pesticides and/or herbicide treated
material.
- Add compost to your garden a few weeks before
you plant and let it sit before you plant.
- Bugs, worms and most bugs are good for your
compost pile.
- If you must throw away your yard waste, place
it into a separate bag and then set it into the
tan bin or black can.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Recycling helps conserve resources and creates a healthy environment for our community and future generations. Make sure to bag garbage and recyclable items Separately and place them into the appropriate containers provided (garbage into black containers) (recyclables into blue containers). GARBAGE

Place all of these items in the garbage:

- Aluminum Foil - contaminated with food scraps
- Candy Wrappers
- Cardboard Roll/Box with Plastic Wrap attached
Or, remove the plastic wrap, and place in recycling.
- Ceramics
- Clothes
- Diapers - clean or dirty
- Dryer Lint and Dryer Sheets
- Fabric
- Juice Boxes and Foil or Coated-Paper Drink Pouches (Flavored drinks, Hi-C, Juicy Juice, or Capri Sun)
Made of two different materials, not recyclable.
- Mirrors
Made of two different materials, not recyclable.
- Old Shoes
- Plastic Grocery Bags - dirty
- Plastic Toys - Made of two different materials, not recyclable.
- Porcelain and China - Made of clay/glazing.
- Potato Chip or Foil Cookie Bags
Made with Mylar, not recyclable.
- Resealable Storage Bags - (Ziploc, sandwich, storage, etc.)
- Polystyrene/Foam - **place pellets into bag & seal**
- Glass Windows
- Palms, Bamboo, or Yucca
(cut to smaller portions, container lid must close)
- Meats, Poultry Fish, Seafood, Dairy etc.

RECYCLE

Place all of these items loosely into the recycling bin.

PAPER - Exception: paper with a waxy or foil coating.

- Office Paper
Staples are okay...**REMOVE** paper clips.
- Cardboard, Cereal, Gift, and Shoe Boxes
Flatten boxes
- Catalogs, Junk Mail, Magazines, Newspapers
- Chipboard Boxes (cracker, cereal, crayon, detergent boxes, etc.)
Flatten boxes
- Wrapping Paper
- **Milk Cartons**
- Paper Bags - **place dirty bags in yard waste**
- Paper Egg Cartons
- Pizza Boxes - **must be clean, used boxes-compost**
- Post-It Notes, Shredded Paper - **place into bags and seal**
- Poster Board
- Telephone Books



CANS - rinse, dry containers

- Aluminum Cans, Steel/Tin Cans (soup, vegetable, fruit, or pet-food cans, etc.)
- Aluminum Foil - Clean only

GLASS - remove lids and rinse containers


- Glass Bottles, Jars & Lids - **remove lid and rinse** (applesauce, pasta sauce, juice, tea, beer, wine, colored-glass bottles, etc.)

PLASTIC - rinse, dry containers or bags

- Plastic Cups (**not foam**), knives, forks, spoons
- Dry-Cleaning Bags
- Plastic Bottles & Containers, Lids - **remove lids** (milk, juice, bleach, liquid detergent, shampoo, soda bottles, etc.)
- **Clean** Plastic Grocery or Yard Waste Bags

GLASS or PLASTIC Bottles with "CRV"

- "CA Redemption Value", or "CA-Refund" on the label. Any plastic with the following recycling symbols:
